

Subsidized Child Care Payment Programs

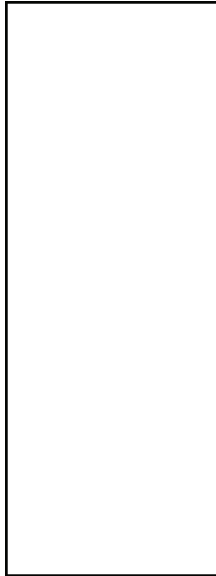
These programs are designed to provide payment of child care costs to families who meet certain need requirements, such as employment, education, training, homelessness, and other special needs.

Eligibility for the various programs is based on family size and gross income. These programs provide parents with the widest freedom of choice possible in selection of child care programs, while helping parents become economically self-sufficient.



Referral Policy

Modoc Child Care Resource and Referral believes that parents are best able to choose the child care that meets their particular family situation. MCCR&R will make referrals, not recommendations to licensed family child care homes and centers.
